FAQ SHEET:

What is the “No Money No Problem” initiative?

It is an opportunity for students to take advantage of all available aid and scholarships which could result in students having no out of pocket tuition costs.

Who is eligible?

- Adults with some college
- Adults with no college
- Recent high school graduates
- Dual enrolled high school students
- Career changers
- Anyone who needs a do-over/ start college again
- Any SC resident
- To qualify, students must complete a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) and have exhausted all other grants, aid, scholarships, etc. Assistance may include but is not limited to grants (Federal Pell Grants, Federal Supplemental Opportunity Grant, S.C. Needs-Based Grant); and scholarships, SC Lottery Tuition Assistance Program (LTAP), etc. and attend at least 6 credit hours
- Please be sure your FAFSA has been completed. For Summer enrollment it will be the 2022/2023 FAFSA and for Fall it will be the 2023/2024 FAFSA.

What about non-credit courses?

This initiative does not cover non-credit courses, but funding is frequently available for those as well. Call Edgar Stagers, Director of Workforce Training (843-355-4177) or Donna Walters, Administrative Assistant (843-355-4116) to inquire about continuing education courses or workforce development courses and opportunities.

FAQ SHEET:

Who are college-eligible students?

- Anyone who has received a high school diploma or GED (graduate equivalency degree).
- Anyone who enrolls at WTC and takes a minimum of six credit hours (typically two courses)
- Includes full-time and part-time students (taking a minimum of 6 credit hours)
- Online and in-person
- South Carolina residents
- Nonresidents meeting SC residency requirements
- DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals)
- International students (must have a valid F1 visa to attend WTC)
- Dual enrolled high school students

Student Eligibility Requirements

Currently enrolled WTC students and new/returning students who have been accepted into an eligible academic program and who live or work full time in South Carolina (must meet residency rules and provide proof of residency or employment), please make note of the following:

- Currently enrolled students are not required to submit a separate application to receive consideration
- All students/ applicants must meet all admissions requirements and must complete the 2022-2023 FAFSA for Summer 2024 and the 2023/2024 FAFSA for Fall 2024 (Non – US Citizen students/applicants do not need to complete a FAFSA)
- Any outstanding balance due to WTC, if applicable, must be satisfied before registering for Spring 2023
- Must declare an eligible program/major; non-degree students are not eligible for assistance
- Must enroll in a minimum of 6 credit hours each semester
- All eligible aid, to include LIFE, PELL, Lottery, SCWINS, etc., will be disbursed to the student's account first; scholarship funding will be available to assist students with any remaining tuition balances
- Additional fees will be the responsibility of the student which include textbooks and supplies
- Must maintain satisfactory academic process

FAQ SHEET:

The South Carolina Workforce Industry Needs Scholarship (SCWINS) and Workforce Scholarships and Grants shall be limited to South Carolina residents enrolled in critical workforce programs that lead to an industry recognized credential (IRC), certificate, diploma or degree in the following areas:

- Healthcare
- Computer Technology and Information
- Advanced Manufacturing
- Hospitality/ Tourism Management
- Construction
- Transportation, Distribution and Logistics
- Criminal Justice and Corrections
- Early Care and Education
- Human Services
- Agriculture and Natural Resources
- Business Management and Administration

Priority awarding must be provided to students who are enrolled in the following critical workforce programs within the 2023-2024 fiscal year. Funds shall be used to cover the total costs of the program (i.e., tuition, fees, or expenses for course related materials) up to the maximum annual limit of \$5,000.

- CompTIA
- Cybersecurity
- Diesel Technician
- Electric Vehicle Technology
- Emergency Medical Technician
- Heavy Equipment Operator
- HVAC
- Lineman Technician
- Manufacturing Technician
 - Mechatronics
 - Nursing
- Nursing Assistant
- Patient Care Technician
 - Phlebotomy
 - Plumbing
 - Welding
